COVID-19 IN LIBERIA AND SIERRA LEONE

Keeping One Step Ahead

Four years ago marked the end of the Ebola crisis in West Africa, which swept through Liberia and Sierra Leone. It killed many people, left behind orphans, broken families, and broken spirits. The Ebola crisis forced many into extreme poverty, and it has been a hard road back. In many ways, the region still hasn't fully recovered.



In Liberia, your donations have helped our church partners distribute hundreds of hand-washing stations to rural villages.

So when COVID-19 started to spread around the world, our church partners in these countries acted fast. They called out to us for help, and you responded.

Over the last 3 months, generous donations have provided communities with hand washing

stations equipped with soap and clean water so that villagers can prevent the spread of COVID-19. Moreover, your donations have provided our partners with masks, gloves, and COVID-19 training so that the lifetransforming work local churches are involved with does not stop. Because whether there is a disease or not, people still need to be able to grow crops in order to feed their families.

Throughout it all, our partners are steadfast in prayer knowing that God is the one that looks after them. In Sierra Leone, a weekly prayer is broadcast over public radio for comfort and to remind people where their hope is. Thank you for all your support. Because of your prayers and generosity, no one in our communities has become sick and people are still able to be trained to grow more food to feed themselves and their families.

EXPANDING CONSERVATION AGRICULTURE IN KENYA

The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches.

She can barely hold back her excitement.

For years Jackline has struggled to feed her growing children. She often skipped meals so that her kids would have just a little more to eat. It is only one of the many sacrifices mothers like her in Kenya make.

But thanks to donors like you, this season is different from all the others. As Jackline walks through her small 1-acre field, she is excited to show us her crops which have already experienced tremendous growth despite the lack of rainfall this year. The secret of her success has been the new **Conservation Agriculture** training she has been able to learn from Fadhili – one of our local church partners.

Unlike the farming methods the government teaches, which results in soil erosion and poor yields, conservation agriculture focuses on enriching the soil with nutrients and preventing water loss through proper mulching and extensive groundcover.

Your donations enabled Fadhili to expand its excellent training from Village Savings Groups to include conservation agriculture as well. By combining the two, people like Jackline can earn more income through farming and grow their wealth exponentially through the savings groups.



The results are so remarkable that we have seen people climb out of poverty in just a few years – not only being able to feed their children but also send them to school – even college!

But feeding bellies is not the only outcome of the training. Run with local churches, before and after each training session a prayer time is held. People learn that they are valued by God and that he has given them gifts and abilities to use.

Thanks to your donations, Jackline now has a hope for the future and says:

FEEDING HOPE

AN UPDATE FROM COLOMBIA

Last December, hundreds of Christians across Canada gave generously to help local churches in Colombia run a feeding program for Venezuelan refugee children. Children visit the churches to receive a hearty lunch, play games, and be cared for by loving volunteers.

Since the spread of COVID-19, we have had to modify the program to instead deliver the food to the homes where these children and their families live.

One of these families is Eliainy, her husband and two children – one of which has Epilepsy. In Venezuela they had a successful life; Eliainy worked in a pharmacy. But since the crisis they have lost everything. With no medicine for their child, they decided to take the long journey to Colombia and settle as refugees next to a garbage dump in Barranquilla.

Their hopes for refuge were destroyed when Eliainy and her husband couldn't work without proper documentation. With nothing and nowhere to go, they were in disbelief as to what their life had become.

It was just then when Pastor Gabriella noticed the young family and invited them to be part of the Oasis Food Program. Since then, Eliainy's children have been getting daily food, and have been gaining some weight.

Only Jesus can satisfy the emotional and spiritual needs of His people, and we have the duty to point each Venezuelan refugee towards Him."
