## How You're Helping Farmers Go from Deficit to Surplus

Do you remember your first paycheque? Perhaps it was as a teenager selling papers. Or your first "real" job after leaving college. There's a special feeling that comes along with it, isn't there? A sense of accomplishment. Not one of pride, but confidence.

As Yona examines his freshly harvested millet, he can't help but share with us his dreams, "Soon, in the future, I will be able to sell food."

To you and I, we might not realize how significant this moment is in Yona's life. But this thought, even having the possibility of having enough crop to actually sell... It's incredible to Yona.

A father of six, Yona has lived in the Dodoma region of Tanzania his entire life. The biggest problem in the region is drought. It is a semi-arid region which gets very little rainfall. In the dry season, dust storms kick up and sting the eyes. And over the last little while, things have only

begun to get worse.

Yona explains that 20 years ago, there were thick forests here and that there was enough rainfall. But because of poverty, the trees have been cut for charcoal. The land has become barren. And the rain isn't as consistent as before. To survive the long hunger season, Yona and his family resorted to foraging for wild roots and fruits.


But it isn't enough and lacks the necessary proteins and nutrients for growing children.

But then "the church has brought us together," Yona says. "I used to carry out traditional agriculture, but then I got training on conservation agriculture. I listened to everything that was taught, and have been able to harvest a lot."

Thanks to donors like you, local churches in Tanzania have been equipped to go beyond their walls and meet the physical and spiritual needs of people around them. One of the key tools they use is conservation agriculture—a series of simple, environmentally friendly farming practices that improve yields while restoring the soil.

Last year Yona harvested nine bags of millet on one acre of land. He proudly shows us his many grain silos he built in his home. Millet is a favoured crop due to its productivity and ability to grow in dry conditions. It's rich in protein, fibre and several B vitamins. Now his family has enough to eat and praises God.

As farming conditions continue to change, farmers are forced to adapt. Through Tearfund, you're helping farming families adapt to the new realities of a changing climate so that they can continue to feed their families and climb out of poverty.

How you're helping farmers become resilient and climb out of poverty:



#### Mindset change

Helping communities see the assets they have and equipping them to understand that change is possible is the first step to long-term transformation.



#### **Water Accessibility**

Erratic rains have made access to water unpredictable. Reservoir digging, irrigation channels, and terraced hills allows farmers to access water year-round.



### Re-introducing Indigenous Crops

Local crops are better at growing in harsh conditions and often more nutritious than introduced varieties from Europe or North America.



#### **Replanting Forests**

Deforestation due to charcoal burning and farming has left the landscape desolate and susceptible to erosion. Replanting forests holds soil in place and provides a cooling effect for neighbouring villages.



#### **Restoring the Soil**

Years of overtilling and erosion have left many fields devoid of nutrients. Through no-till planting, mulch, natural fertilizer, and intercropping farmers are able to replenish the soil once again leading to thriving crops
