Your support enabled us to train 391 churches in Church and Community Transformation, equipping them with tools and knowledge to transform their communities and help people escape from physical and spiritual poverty. How one widow's death led to 90 people knowing Jesus

Nestled in the rural community of Segno, Ethiopia, Gununo Stadium Church has faithfully preached God's word for generations. But Pastor Mesfin Yacob knew something more had to be done. The poverty around them was overwhelming. Families in the community lived without adequate shelter, food, or education. He longed for a way for his church to minister to the "whole person" but didn't know exactly how to start—until Tearfund's Church and Community Transformation (CCT) training provided a way.



Thanks to donors like you, Pastor Mesfin and his church learned more about what the Bible had to say about the poor and what they could do to help. They were trained how to identify needs within the community and create an action plan to meet them. The impact was almost immediate. Within a year, the church helped 39 people with healthcare needs, provided education to 10 children, and even started a community garden! Each one of these initiatives demonstrated the love of Christ. But it was the story of a woman named Reta that transformed the entire village.

Recently widowed, Reta lived in a mud home that was falling apart. She was in dire need. In response, the church built her a new home, but tragically, she died a few weeks later. So, the church decided to organize her funeral.

Reta's extended family attended the funeral but were skeptical of the church's motives. But after witnessing the immense love they had for Reta and the grief they shared, their hearts were tremendously moved. As a result, 13 households—nearly 90 people—gave their lives to Jesus that day!

Your support and prayers provide churches like Gununo Church the tools and training they need to reach beyond their walls and meet the physical and spiritual needs around them. Thanks to you, we are seeing thousands of lives being transformed.



Your partnership is helping end extreme hunger

Hunger involves far more than just what's on the dinner table. Without food, everything suffers: health, education, self-confidence... the list goes on. But thanks to you, hunger is being pushed back. By coming alongside Tearfund and its local church partners, you're helping provide more than short-term relief. Through our innovative agriculture techniques, economic training, and transitional programs, you're helping end hunger for families now and for the future.

Feature: The Road to Recovery

The 2020-2022 civil war in Ethiopia was one of the most brutal and deadly conflicts in recent memory. Hundreds of thousands of civilians died, and millions more were displaced. With the help of donors like you we were able to provide emergency food to families on the verge of starvation. But now that the fighting is over, our attention has turned to recovery.



People returning to their villages are finding their houses burned, possessions looted, and farms destroyed. But thanks to you, we are able to help them rebuild. Last year we were able to help 1,200 households replant their crops. 6000 kg of seed were distributed along with 800 sickles, 400 hoes, 1000 ploughshares, and 1200 spades. Over 300 hectares of land were cultivated, harvesting 1,200,000 kg of teff. Going forward, over 600 goats will be distributed and families will be trained in conservation agriculture and enrolled in saving groups.

A thriving field and renewed confidence

"We were destitute. We were just very hopeless. The only hope for us was God," Bereket shared as he recalled his former situation.

For years, Bereket Ukesa and his family lived in hunger and despair in Hobicha, Ethiopia. The rains, which were once steady and predictable, had become erratic. They often came weeks later than usual. In some years, they never came at all.



As a result, his family farm could no longer sustain

them. Each day was a struggle to provide for his wife and four young children. Meals were skipped, portions were meagre, and malnutrition took its toll. The lack of food weighed heavily not only on their bodies but also on their spirits. "The community disregarded me. They gave me less respect because of my status," he said, recalling the shame of being unable to contribute during communal events. Not being able to provide for his children tore his self-confidence to shreds.

But donors like you made a difference in Bereket's life. Your support provided Bereket training in climate-smart agriculture techniques such as crop rotation, mulching, and no-till planting. The results were almost miraculous, transforming his once-barren field into a miniature garden of Eden overflowing with maize, potatoes, and pumpkins. At last, he was able to feed his family, send his children to school, and even invest in livestock!

"During the time of difficulties, I was hopeless for my children because of shortage of food. They didn't go to school. But now, I can send them to school!" Bereket exclaims. "I'm dreaming for them to grow to a higher level in education."

Today, Bereket's fields are thriving, and so is his confidence. He asks that you would continue to pray for this same transformation in his whole community. "I'm not just changed, I'm transformed," Bereket explains. "I'm food secure and so happy. My family is so happy."



Your partnership is helping families break free from poverty

Poverty is more than finances—it affects a person's whole being. It robs people of their voice and selfconfidence. Once a family is in extreme poverty, escaping the generational cycle can be next to impossible. But thanks to your partnership, we're making a difference. By providing families with ways they can save and grow their income using their own Godgiven skills and abilities, you are not only helping people change their economics, but find new hope.

The Ripple Effect of Saving Groups

In many low-income countries, basic financial services like saving accounts and loans are virtually non-existent. When emergency strikes, families are often forced to sell valuable assets or approach predatory loan sharks, who often charge impossible interest rates—both of which perpetuate the cycle of poverty. Village Savings and Loans Groups provide an answer, giving families a place to save and take out loans. These loans are used for a variety of purposes, including:



Sending children to school



Investing in new businesses



Buying farm land



Paying doctors' bills



Remaining together

Out of poverty in 3 years

"Click-click-click-click" goes Mariamu's sewing machine. "Life here is not easy," she explains. "You need to hustle. You need to struggle yourself to make life livable." A mother of three in rural Tanzania, Mariamu's life was once defined by constant struggle. Owning a small tailoring business, she and her husband could barely afford the cost of food for her family. It was ironic that some years she couldn't even afford proper clothes for her children!



But thanks to donors like you, one day, Mariamu was given the opportunity to join a Village Savings and Loans (VSL) group. What she learned at the group was transformative. "I learned from the experience of other members on how to manage living," she says. Through the group, she not only gained financial skills, but business and household skills too. With these skills, she slowly began slowly began lifting her family out of poverty.

After one year in the group, she had saved enough to buy two acres of land. In the second year, she was able to build a separate two-room building for her business. "I started with one sewing machine. I later bought a second one and then a third special one which can make different designs [...] I have also used some money from the group to buy five pigs."

The new structure meant that customers no longer had to go into her living room. Not only that, but the second room was built with the aim of training students. Mariamu now has 3 trainees. Within just 3 years her life has completely changed!

"We are living very comfortably compared to before," she explains. Her children are now able to buy new clothes and attend school without worry—and she is far from the only one. Thanks to donors like you, thousands of women have been able to lift their families out of poverty and see a future of hope.





Your partnership is helping women and girls thrive

In many parts of the world. women continue to face severe inequality and poverty that limits their opportunities. They are often treated as "less than" and are victims of violence and abuse. Yet studies show that when women thrive, the whole community thrives. Through Tearfund, you are partnering to remove barriers for women so that they can take advantage of new opportunities and flourish.

Feature: Faith through the Flood

When floods in South Sudan destroyed Mary's farm, she lost everything. Months of work gone in a matter of hours. With her husband gone to war and eight children to take care of, Mary broke down.

But just when everything seemed lost, Mary received help to be able to get off her feet. The food aid she received helped bridge the gap, but it was the village savings group that gave her the tools to thrive. Mary saved small amounts of money to eventually open her own thriving restaurant. Through these VSL groups, Tearfund is equipping hundreds of women like Mary to be resilient.

Her family wanted her to marry a man twice her age

Rebecca's world shattered in a single moment. She remembers the day she home from school to find her life was no longer her own—her family had arranged for her to marry a man twice her age! "They told me it was decided three years ago, when I was just 14," Rebecca shares. "I told them I wasn't ready to get married. I'm only 17... and I didn't even know who he was!"



Terrified but resolute, that night, she fled to the only safe place she could think of: a nearby church. There,

the Bishop's wife opened the door and listened as Rebecca poured out her story. The couple gave her refuge, and through Tearfund's Trauma Healing program, her journey toward healing began.

The program has helped Rebecca see her worth and dignity through God's eyes: "I learned I am made in the image of God. I don't have to marry if I'm not ready." A member of the trauma healing group welcomed Rebecca into her home, enabling her to continue her studies and graduate high school.

But the battle wasn't over. When her family discovered her location, they agreed to cancel the marriage if she would come home—only to increase her bride price and try again! Rebecca fled once more, trusting God to guide her steps.

Today, Rebecca's faith is stronger than ever. "I think this whole experience has brought me closer

to God," she says. "I continue to pray that God would change the minds of my parents." She longs to complete her education and keeps praying and fasting as she makes these decisions.

Through support from donors like you, Rebecca has hope, safety, and a future rooted in God's love.

Working with local partners is key to long-term change.

Local leaders are embedded in their communities and remain there long after we leave. In many cases, the staff of our local partners have grown up and have lived around the areas we work their entire lives. They know the needs, local actors, language, and context. Because of this, they are usually able to access areas or create buy-ins that an external staff would not be able to. Through working with local partners, we are able to create sustainable change more effectively.

The point of no return

Mary could hear gunfire getting closer and closer to her home in Manipur, India. Her walls began to vibrate from the impact of nearby explosions. She grabbed what she could carry and fled on foot with her two young children into the night. They had to go quickly while there was still a chance to leave.



She fled to her sister-in-law's home a couple of villages away. "We thought, like every time, it would cool down," she tells us. "But after waiting for a week, we learned that our village was burned, our houses were burned. We then knew we had to flee. We didn't take anything, not even a suitcase... I was so nervous I couldn't think about anything."

At age 24, Mary was one of 50,000 Kuki people who fled ethnic and religious violence in Manipur state, India. Like many others, Mary and her two young boys, ages 1 and 5, travelled south to seek refuge in the neighbouring state of Mizoram. She explains the journey: "It normally takes 12 or 15 hours to travel from Lamka (Manipur) to Aizawl (Mizoram), but for us, we were with my sister-in-law and there were 5 children and our vehicle was very crowded, and the children were vomiting. We took around 24 hours."

Reunited with her husband the family now lives in a refugee complex in Mizoram, and feel a bit more secure. Donors like you helped our local church partner provide her family with emergency food donations, diapers, and baby formula. "They gave us everything. We were so grateful," she says.

As the world becomes increasingly turbulent, stories like Mary's are tragically becoming more common. But thanks to you, we are able to respond. You are providing love and hope to those in desperate need.

Your partnership is helping care for creation

Torrential rains, massive erosion, land degradation, soil infertility: creation groans for its final redemption. While many of us in Canada are insulated from environmental calamity, the impact on the poor is all too real. With your support, we are helping farmers and communities in Africa adapt to the changing conditions and care for creation so that they can not only survive for today but find hope for tomorrow.

Feature: Climate and Poverty

One of the favourite topics we like to talk about is the weather. Why? Because it directly affects our daily lives and changes regularly. This is true in Canada, and even morso in the places we serve.

When climate patterns change it often has an adverse affect on growing conditions and food availability. When crops need more care, children are often called home from school to help work the farm, inhibiting educational learning. Families will migrate to other areas in an attempt to survive. This often leads to conflict with local groups who already live in those areas, and in the worst cases, even war.

As Andrew Spence outlines, "The poor are the ones most significantly impacted by pollution because they have the greatest need for the economic benefits brought by polluting businesses, the least political clout to resist bad policies, and a lack of resources to relocate away from the problem [...] In a real sense, making wise choices about the environment is a way of caring for the poor. Good stewardship is one way we can love our neighbours."

The life-giving power of water

The spring was flowing again for the first time in years. It was a miracle.

For years, John Mwangangi and his cousin, Judas, struggled to grow enough to feed their families. The land was parched. Due to changing rains and deforestation, all the springs on the mountain had dried up years



ago. Hope seemed as scarce as the water.

Life was particularly difficult for Judas, who crawled around the farm using primitive wooden crutches, due to a condition which left him disabled from birth. Year after year, the two families worked together to cultivate their modest farm, feeding on whatever they could. But they felt that survival was impossible.

But thanks to you, there was an opportunity to bring life back to the land. Last year, donors like you helped fund Tearfund's Nature Positive landscape restoration project in Kenya, aiming to turn barren land into fruitful soil. Through tree planting, water conservation efforts, and sustainable agriculture, the mountain transformed overnight. A few months went by and then a miracle happened—a spring that had died up years ago came back to life! For John, this spring is more than just water, it is life.

Through sustainable farming techniques like climate-smart agriculture and a focus on restoring ecosystems, Tearfund is turning barren land into fruitful soil. Families like John's can now dream again of abundant harvests, education for children, and a brighter future.

Investing in Systems and Processes

We have been blessed to be able to invest into more projects and lift more families out of poverty over the last few years. In order to continue to increase our impact and be good stewards of what God has given us, we recognize the need to invest in more robust systems and processes, including financial systems, IT support, and HR.
